Budget Questions

As we receive questions throughout time in regards to the finances of NGR and about the budget— we would like to help explain some questions that will hopefully help you. A copy of the budget can be obtained at the office or in the Annual Book for the association.

- Q. Does money the churches send to NGR help fund the BSU?
- A. No. Money that is sent to NGR goes into the general fund, which is used only for the ministry of the association. Those items include the utility costs, insurances, salaries (for the Director of Mission, Secretary and Custodians), ministries such as WMU, Brotherhood, Youth, Sunday School, Discipleship, etc.
- Q. How does the BSU obtain funds?
- A. Churches or individuals that send money will mark on the check that it is for the BSU. That money goes into the BSU checking account, and is used only by the BSU.
- Q. Does money the Church send buy items in the Bookstore?
- A. No. The Bookstore is a ministry of the association, such as Sunday School, WMU, Youth, etc., but it is non-profit and self-supporting. All funds received over the expenses goes into the general fund to help with the ministry work of the Association. All items (excluding Lifeway products) are discounted off the retail price. Through the Bookstore, there has been opportunity to share the gospel, encourage people, to inform people about churches in the association, and many other opportunities arise.
- Q. How can I find out what my Church has sent to the association?
- A. Each month the Encourager will list the amount given to the association in one column and what was given to the BSU in the other column. The month is listed in the upper left corner. Checks are documented on the day they are received at the Mission Center.

All girls grades 1-6 are invited to attend, whether or not their churches have active GA organizations.

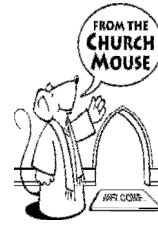
Girls will meet missionaries, participate in games, crafts, music, Bible study, prayer and more! They will enjoy meeting girls from other churches.

Edinburg— We had our annual candlelight ceremony on Christmas Eve. There were 62 in attendance.

Our Christmas program was cancelled for Sunday, December 21st due to the bad weather and was rescheduled for December 28th. The program was performed by the children. There was a large crowd that attended. Candy, oranges and nuts were given each child after the program.

On Wednesday, January 7th, the Women on Mission held their annual soup supper in conjunction with their regular monthly meeting.

Saturday, January 17th was our men's breakfast with 36 in attendance.

Galt— We delivered a box of donations to the women's shelter. Thirty shoeboxes were filled and taken to the drop site in Chillicothe. The youth hosted a "parent's night out" on December 19th. They provided free babysitting for 13 children. The evening was spent making crafts, playing games, decorating cookies and making homemade pizza.

Princeton— The WOM groups projects were Food for Families and Adopt a Family for Christmas.

A children's skit was done before morning worship on Sunday, December 7th. The Youth Christmas Program was held during worship service on Sunday, December 21st. The Christmas Candlelight service was held on Christmas Eve.

The WOM 3 Group held a New Year's Party on Tuesday, December 30th with 27 in attendance. The Youth Group held a New Year's Party (lock-in) on Wednesday, December 31, with 38 in attendance.

Shelburne Church- We now have a new medium blue carpet in the sanctuary, which replaced a 35 plus year old red one. An all-church hayride was enjoyed by all. We toured Posey Park and came back to the church and had a devotional and hot-dog roast.

Marcia Bland took some of the youth to Ferguson, MO, to attend a Life Action Ministry Summit for the weekend.

Shelburne hosted a Thanksgiving Service with Edinburg and Dockery Chapel. Bro. Stan Rushton brought the message. Refreshments were served after the service.

Pastor Brad, the deacons and wives hosted an appreciation dinner for the Church in December.

Exciting news! At the December business meeting Bro. Brad Walker was called as fulltime pastor. He will begin serving in this capacity after his school term ends in Chillicothe. That's a Praise!

The ladies from Shelburne served 46 for the first BSU lunch on January 14. It was a cold, blustery day but they braved the weather and came.

TWELVE from Shelburne attended the Pastor/Deacon/Wives Conference in Bethany recently.

Seven have united with Shelburne in the last few months; one coming by baptism. What a Blessing!

Trenton First— There were 110 attending the Christmas Eve Service. We are starting Bible Studies, Esther and Fireproof. The Senior Adults will be having a salad luncheon and then do a Bible Study beginning with the "Beverly Hillbillies". The Senior Adult meeting will be January 23 at 1:30 p.m. They will be making valentines again this year for missions. Upcoming events- there will be a church dinner February 15, following the morning worship service to celebrate Bro. Denny's 5th anniversary with the church. February 21st will be the coffee house at the activity center at 5 p.m.

MBC Collegiate Ministry of NCMC "Know Him—Make Him Known—Jesus"

Because the college, for the first time this fall, began scheduling classes on Wednesday through the lunch hours, the Wednesday Free Lunch ministry had to be changed in 2 ways. The time was lengthened to give students more time to come over from their 11 am and 12 noon classes, and alternative ways of sharing about Jesus had to be added. Instead of sharing only once during the 2 hours, devotions given by ministers are repeated and more evangelistic DVD clips have been purchased to be played on a cycling basis throughout the 2 hours. A greater concerted effort is also made by Sophomore students and myself to sit by new students in order to make them feel welcomed and take advantage of the opportunity to talk to them about Jesus. Comments like the following were shared thru the semester letting us know that this ministry is truly meeting needs and making changes in student attitudes toward the love and power Jesus has for them. One student spoke across the room so everyone present would hear. She said, "Diann, all of the nursing students have decided that we should come over every Wednesday, before we take our test." I said, "Really? Why?" Her response, "You know, last week when you prayed for all of us over the test we were going to take that day?", "Yes," I said. "Everyone in the class, even those who weren't here for you to pray for, passed the test! It's the first time that has ever happened." Early on in the semester another student of about 30 years shared, "I laid out last year from school, because I lost my mother who was my best friend and supporter." "When I came back this year, I was scared and depressed, thinking that I might not be able to do this again. I am so glad you are still doing this lunch ministry, because they mean so much to me and have really encouraged me not to give up. Thank you, so much." These are only a few of the comments about the many opportunities we have been given to minister to these students, sowing encouragement and hope, and especially new understanding that Jesus really cares and loves them.

The other ministry the Lord has really blessed in 2 major ways this past semester has been the "Sunday Night Alive". The students living in the dorms have been ministered to, seeing an average of 35-40 students in attendance. One night 47 students ate supper and watched the Louie Giglio film "*How Great is Our God.*" The second blessing has come from our churches and individuals in our association, who have gone out of their way to bless the BSU with 2 huge sacks of frozen deer meat, numerous #10 gallon cans of chili, beans, nacho cheese sauce, bags of pasta noodles, taco seasoning, etc, etc, etc.. This has cut our cost of feeding these 40--6' to 6'5" tall students from \$75-\$80 per week, to about \$15 per week for the smaller needed items. Thank you, all of you for blessing this ministry. Lives are being changed. Thanksgiving Sunday, saw us share the meal with 63 students; Ken Franklin, a brand new Christian, share his testimony; and a student share her testimony about how Jesus had not only saved her but had also brought her through some very terrible personal family problems.

For those churches and individuals who not only see the BSU ministry as a REAL opportunity of sharing Jesus, but also support the BSU with consistent unfailing prayer support, Thank you. "Thank You" also to our NGRBA church families, individuals, and churches outside NGRBA, for your past, present, and future financial support. Most of you not only give a monthly financial support to our NGR Baptist Association, but you also in addition give a monthly support to the BSU ministry. These monthly BSU offerings and prayers are the main reason the BSU is able to continue sharing Jesus. This spring, our Lord has brought to us students from all over the United States, South Africa, West Africa, Zimbabwe, Lithuania and beyond. He has brought these students here to our Jerusalem for a short season. Please prayerfully consider how you can continue to help the BSU share Jesus with them, encouraging them to become serious about HIM. "Satan truly is a roaring Lion, roaming to and fro, seeking whom he may devour. . . Let's not grow weary in well doing."
